# SCHOOL PROGRAM

The DIA provides free field trips, both virtual and in-museum for K-12 students in Wayne County. In-Museum experiences also include free transportation.

In 2021, more than **1,600** students participated in no-cost school field trips to the DIA with free bus transportation. More than **9,700** students participated in guided virtual field trips.

In support of Detroit Public Schools Community District's Cultural Passport program, 2nd grade students participated in a virtual, guided field trip experience. The DIA hosted this program in coordination with each classroom teacher. The DIA also worked with 5 DPSCD teachers to co-create learning resources to support the Cultural Passport program for the 21– 22 school year.

Guided virtual field trips were the primary offering for K-12 students until October when the DIA welcomed school groups back to the Museum after suspending this option due to COVID – 19. Virtual Field Trips are offered by reservations made through the Museum’s Group Reservations Department and engage students with art through live online forums. Students ask questions, engage in discussion, and participate in activities that promote critical-thinking and close-looking. Guided field trip experiences, both virtual and in-person, include:

Learning to Look, grades 2–4: Combines open-ended discussion and activities to help students connect to their thoughts and feelings, as well as to the experiences of others.

Thinking Through Art, grades 3–12: Concentrates on open-ended, student-centered discussions using the Visual Thinking Strategies pedagogical approach and gallery engagement activities.

Shaping Identity, grades 3–12: Focuses on the following DIA collection and curricular areas: *Arts of Africa*, *Art of the Americas*, *Art of the Ancient World*, and *Shaping Identity*, *World Languages*.

Shaping Identity, combined with Thinking Through Art, grades 3–12: Explores the breadth of the collections in combination with directed and open-ended discussions and activities.

Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) and Art, grades 5-12: Provides tours tailored to the teachers’ goals. Tours may consider themes of friendship, creativity, gratitude, generosity, kindness, patience and/or honesty, followed by a self-guided or teacher-led activity or a teamwork exercise.

Homeschool Afternoons: Offers collaborative, learner-centered artmaking in the DIA Learning Center & Studio and guided museum tours to local homeschool families.

Survey data is collected after each field trip, or educator workshop, and the results are used to inform changes to programming.

The DIA-Education department publishes a monthly newsletter, EduNews, that highlights new programs and resources available to local schools.

New teacher resources available in 2021 included classroom activities for *Detroit Style: Car Design in the Motor City, 1950–2020*, *Russ Marshall: Detroit Photographs from 1958–2008*, materials about the *Detroit Industry murals*, and Conservation–STEAM initiatives.

## CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT & SUPPORT FOR EDUCATORS

### ***DIA Delivered***

These educational kits connect the school curriculum to objects in the Museum’s collection and provide opportunities for critical thinking, discovery, and artmaking.



Each kit contains lesson plans, age-appropriate books, videos, exercises, and all necessary supplies to complete the suggested artmaking activities. DIA Delivered includes a professional development plan to help teachers utilize this resource in the classroom or in a virtual learning environment.

Kits were provided to East English Village Preparatory Academy, Lovin Touch, Charles R Drew Transition Center, Carver STEM Academy, Sacred Heart Catholic School, Edmonson Elementary School, and a Detroit-based homeschool.

The DIA continued to work collaboratively with educators in Detroit to design customized curriculum resources to support field trips, including self-guided activities as well as pre- and post-visit classroom connections. Kits are available for East Asian Art, African, African American, American, and Native American art. Kits are in development for Ancient Middle Eastern, Egyptian, and Greek and Roman art.

### ***Art Bytes***

## Additional Engagement with Wayne County Schools

### ***Teacher Advisory Group***

This group provided feedback about existing professional development resources and assisted in designing teacher events and includes teachers from Wayne County Schools.

### ***Teen Arts Council***

The DIA's Teen Arts Council includes students from Wayne County high schools. Teen Council members work with diverse peers from local high schools and museum professionals to design and implement relevant and meaningful programs for metro Detroit teens.

# SENIOR PROGRAM

The DIA provides experiences for Tri-County Seniors through virtual programs and group trips to the Museum.

Due to the COVID – 19 pandemic, in-museum programming continued to be suspended in 2021. To accommodate tri-county seniors during this time, the DIA transitioned the Senior Program to a virtual format. With *Thursdays at the Museum—Virtual*, offered at 1:00 pm each week, the DIA provided engaging experiences and programs: interactive talks with Q & A sessions alternate with music, film, artmaking, and special events like Art Bingo. ## ***Behind the Seen – In the Community & Virtual***

Presented by trained DIA teaching volunteers, Behind the Seen art talks bring insight about the DIA's collection from the museum to the community. ## **Inside | Out**

Through partnerships with municipalities and community organizations, the DIA's Inside | Out program brings high-quality art reproductions to locations in Wayne County.

In addition to Detroit Metropolitan Airport, Wayne County Community College District, and the Brigitte Harris Cancer Pavilion at Henry Ford Hospital, the 2022 Inside | Out roster will include Canton Township, Hamtramck, Lincoln Park, River Rouge, Willow Metropark in New Boston, Detroit's Greektown, Rouge Park, and Osborne Neighborhood Alliance.

## Partners in Public Art

Partners in Public Art is a collaboration between the Detroit Institute of Arts, and community organizations in Wayne County to co-create community-driven, highly visible public works of art that express the unique stories and interests of each community.

In 2021, the DIA worked with Detroit's District 2 to complete a mural on Detroit's Avenue of Fashion. *Patterns of the Detroit Community* designed by Hubert Massey and painted by Ijanía Cortez.



The DIA also completed a collaborative project with the Plymouth Downtown Development Authority and the Plymouth Community Arts Council to create a public sculpture near Kellogg Park in Downtown Plymouth.





## **Detroit Public Schools Student Art Show**

In partnership with Detroit Public Schools Community District, the DIA presented the 84th Student Art Exhibition.

In 2021 the exhibition launched online and featured work created by DPSCD students in kindergarten through 12th grade. Media ranged from paintings, prints, drawings, photography, ceramics, videos, and jewelry. The 2022 exhibition will return to the in-museum format.

## **Concert of Colors**

As the main venue for Concert of Colors, the DIA presents Detroit's free annual diversity-themed music festival. As the primary institutional partner for Concert of Colors, the DIA planned and presented Detroit's free annual diversity-themed music festival in 2021.

Due to COVID 19, Concert of Colors was filmed at the Detroit Film Theatre and broadcast on Detroit Public Television, WDET/FM and streamed online to an international audience. More than 100,000 viewed the performances across broadcast TV, radio, and online digital platforms.

## **The Secret Society of Twisted Storytellers**

In celebration of Grandparents Day 2021, Satori Shakoor from The Secret Society of Twisted Storytellers, provided video-making workshops to tri-county residents, offering techniques and insights on the art of storytelling. In a culminating virtual event, the museum presented selected videos from grandparents, parents and grandchildren telling heartfelt stories on the experiences and joys of grandparenting.

## **Community Group Art Making Program**

The DIA works with local social service agencies through the Studio Community Group Program. The following groups participated in virtual classes with materials provided by the DIA.

- ◇ The John D. Dingell VA Medical Center and Mariners Inn painted bowls supplied by DIA staff for the annual Detroit Empty Bowls program, supporting Cass Community Social Services. The John D. Dingell VA Medical Center also created several painted ceramic tile projects

throughout summer and fall of 2021, with one group tile piece winning second place in a national veteran artwork show.

- ◇ Mariners Inn created found object collage artwork in the fall that is now displayed at their facility.
- ◇ Hannan Center's partnership with SAGE of Metro Detroit was supported with a virtual drawing class for both in April. Hannan Center and SAGE partnered again with the DIA with a series of quilt-based classes in the fall, and produced a number of stitch collage projects based on their personal experiences.
- ◇ Alternatives For Girls had virtual artmaking classes in February and April.

### **Inside Out Literary Arts**

The DIA collaborates with Inside Out Literary Arts to engage young writers in art, poetry workshops, and readings.

In partnership with Inside Out Literary Arts, six instructors provided a virtual masterclass centered around the exhibition, *Black Is Beautiful*, leading students and viewers through the writing process, from impression and inspiration to execution, culminating in Spoken Word performances and audience Q&A.

### **Wayne County Community College District**

The DIA and WCCCD develop partnerships to raise visibility and awareness for both institutions, build new audiences, and increase appreciation for the relevance of the arts and continued education in everyday lives.

Highlights of the partnership agreement include Senior Thursday bus trips to the museum for WCCCD's Silver Circle Program, Introduction to Visual Thinking Strategies for faculty, field trips for dual enrollment students and Inside|Out installations on all campuses.

### **Scholastic Art Awards**

The DIA partnered with Detroit's College for Creative Studies to coordinate virtual events for the 2021 Southeastern Michigan Region of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards competition, attended by approximately 2,000 students, family members, and their guests.

## ***Ofrendas: Celebrating el Día de Muertos 2021***

In celebration of Dia de Muertos, the DIA, in partnership with Detroit's Mexican Consulate and the Southwest Business Association, presented a community exhibition of Ofrenda altars.

Celebrating el Día de Muertos was on view during regular museum hours and included with General Admission in 2021.

### **Drop-In Artmaking at Fairs and Festivals**

The DIA provides drop-in artmaking workshops at community events throughout Detroit.

Due to the pandemic and the suspension of these community events, the DIA launched [Creating from Home](#), an online resource for instructional artmaking resources, including downloadable PDFs, which are created monthly, along with instructional artmaking videos that are uploaded to the DIA's YouTube channel.

### **Children's Hospital of Michigan Healing Arts**

DIA studio artists provide artmaking workshops to patients and their families at Children's Hospital of Michigan in Detroit. Workshops typically occur bedside and in common areas of the hospital, such as waiting rooms, activity rooms, and lobbies every week throughout the year. Due to the pandemic, the DIA has provided artmaking kits for patients and their families for distribution by hospital staff

### **Additional Outreach**

The DIA curatorial department provided curatorial lectures to Munger Middle School, University of Detroit Mercy's College of Liberal Arts and Education, and Jefferson Avenue Presbyterian Church. Conservation lectures and consultation services were provided to Wayne State University.
