

Oakland County Art Institute Authority 2020 Program Report

Governance

Thomas Guastello served as the Oakland County appointee to the Detroit Institute of Arts Board of Directors in 2020.

Free General Admission

Residents of Oakland County received unlimited, free general admission to the DIA as specified by the service agreement benefits for county residents.

Oakland County Admissions to the Detroit Film Theatre: 7,999

Total Oakland County Admissions: 25,290

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, the museum was closed from March 13–July 10, 2020. The Detroit Film Theater closed on March 13, 2020 and remains closed due to current COVID 19 restrictions.

School Services and Teacher Programs

Education Programs focus on K-12 offerings in the following areas:

- Expanding field trip offerings;
- Collaborating with educators to support curriculum initiatives; and
- Providing teacher professional development.

The DIA provided free bus transportation to all Oakland County schools when group trips to the museum were available, prior to March 13, 2021. 6,533 students from Oakland County participated in the free field trip program.

Virtual Field Trips are offered by <u>reservation</u> to engage students with art through live forums online. Students have the opportunity to ask questions, engage in discussion, and participate in activities that promote critical-thinking and close-looking.

Guided field trip experiences available for students virtually or in person includes:

- <u>Learning to Look</u>, grades 2–4, combines open-ended discussion and activities to help students connect to their thoughts and feelings, as well as to the experiences of others.
- <u>Thinking Through Art</u>, grades 3–12, concentrates on open-ended, student-centered discussions using the Visual Thinking Strategies pedagogical approach and gallery engagement activities.
- <u>Shaping Identity</u>, grades 3–12, focuses on the following DIA collection and curricular areas:
 - o Arts of Africa
 - Art of the Americas
 - o Art of the Ancient World
 - Shaping Identity World Languages
- <u>Shaping Identity, combined with Thinking Through Art</u>, grades 3–12, explores the breadth of the collections in combination with directed and open-ended discussions and activities.
- <u>Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) and Art</u> provides tours tailored to the teachers' goals. Tours may consider themes of friendship, creativity, gratitude, generosity, kindness, patience and/or honesty, followed by a self-guided or teacher-led activity or a teamwork exercise (for older children in grades 5–12).
- <u>Homeschool Afternoons</u> offers collaborative, learner-centered artmaking in the DIA Learning Center & Studio and guided museum tours to local homeschool families with.

Curriculum Development/Support



DIA Delivered educational kit

DIA Delivered Pilot These educational kits connect the school curriculum to objects in the DIA collection and provide opportunities for critical thinking, discovery, and artmaking. Each kit contains lesson plans, age-appropriate books, videos, manipulatives, and all necessary supplies to complete the suggested artmaking activities. **DIA Delivered** includes a professional development plan to help teachers utilize this resource in the classroom or in a virtual learning environment.

Kits were provided to Dolson Elementary in New Hudson, Thompson K-8 International Academy in Southfield, and Clifford Smart Middle School in Commerce as part of a pilot program in 2020 and will be available by reservation and shipped free to Oakland County schools in 2021.

The DIA continued to work collaboratively with Oakland County educators to design customized curriculum resources to support field trips. Resources included self-guided activities as well as pre- and post-visit classroom connections. Additional kits are available for African, African American, American, and Native American art. Kits are in development for Ancient Middle Eastern, Egyptian, and Greek and Roman art.

Art Bytes In these short videos, the DIA's gallery teachers introduced collection objects to K–12 students, prompting curiosity, wonder, and critical thinking. *Art Byte* videos can be found here.

Teacher Professional Development

The DIA offers professional development workshops for teachers that model and develop curriculum-related activities for immediate in-person or virtual classroom application.

Customized Teacher Professional Development

The DIA actively recruits schools/districts to develop collaborative, customized professional development opportunities for teachers. Adjustments have been made to offer programs on a virtual platform.

Additional Engagement with Oakland County Schools

Teacher Advisory Group

The DIA's Teacher Advisory Group teachers from Oakland County. This group provided feedback about existing professional development resources and assisted in designing teacher events.

Teen Arts Council

The DIA's Teen Arts Council includes students from three Oakland County high schools. Teen Council members work with diverse peers from local high schools and museum professionals to design and implement relevant and meaningful programs for metro Detroit teens.

Senior Program

Thursdays at the Museum

This popular program provides activities for seniors each Thursday in the museum at 1:00 pm. The monthly schedule begins with tours of the permanent collection on the first Thursday; artmaking in the Studio on the third Thursday of the month; and a film shown in the Detroit Film Theatre on the fourth Thursday. The second Thursday of the month offers a variety of experiences such as Art Bingo and music performances.

Thursdays at the Museum, free for all tri-county adults 55+, provided free bus transportation for groups of 25 or more. Individual walk-ins were also invited to participate in the Thursday activities.

The DIA welcomed 18 senior groups to the Museum, serving more than 400 residents prior to the museum closure on March 13, 2020.

Behind the Seen

Behind the Seen art talks bring insight about the DIA's collection to adult civic and social groups, libraries, senior centers, and other community-accessible locations.

Oakland County groups hosted 20 Behind the Seen art talks at the following locations.

To accommodate seniors during the pandemic, the DIA transitioned the tri-county Senior Program to a virtual format.

Thursdays at the Museum—Virtual

Every Thursday at 1:00 pm, the DIA provides engaging experiences and programs: interactive talks with Q & A sessions are varied with music, film, artmaking, and special events like Art Bingo.

Behind the Seen—Virtual

Art talks with live Q & A are provided by the DIA's trained volunteers and available to adult civic and social groups, libraries, and senior centers. Group organizers may select from a variety of topics either for seniors who gather in facilities or those who access the program individually via the organizer's virtual platform.

Anytime Access Programs

Additional virtual programs are available to seniors with online *anytime access* and include crossword puzzles, art making videos, curator, and conservation art talks.

Make, Take, and Connect

Artmaking projects, inspired by works in the DIA collection, were the subject of a pilot program with The Village of Oakland Woods in Pontiac. Kits included materials, instructions, and online curator art talks with Q & A. Feedback from the pilot informed ongoing plans to further engage residents in Oakland—and beyond—with activities that bring DIA experiences to group living communities, independent seniors, and senior centers, as permitted by current COVID restrictions.

Community Collaborations with Local Arts Organizations and Cities, Townships and Villages

In support of the service agreement with the Oakland County Art Institute Authority, the DIA developed community partnership programs, events, and engagement opportunities for residents of Oakland County.

These partnership projects bring museum resources to communities where there is a demonstrated commitment to increasing local arts programs.

Collaborations are codeveloped with local organizations to respect and sustain the mission of the local organization and preserve the local character of each program.

Inside|Out

Through partnerships with municipalities and community organizations, the DIA's Inside|Out program features high-quality art reproductions at locations throughout Oakland County.

The City of Madison Heights and Berkley hosted a virtual ribbon-cutting in July to celebrate their Inside|Out installations.

Partners in Public Art

The DIA collaborates with communities, nonprofit organizations, and municipalities in Oakland County to design and create meaningful works of public art.

In 2020, the DIA completed a mural in partnership with the Orion Art Center and the Lake Orion Downtown Development Authority.

Oakland Community College

The DIA and Oakland Community College formalized a three-year partnership to provide meaningful opportunities for college students, faculty, and staff, as well as for the broader Oakland community to participate in art-based programming.

The DIA provided professional development workshops for faculty, educational experiences, and art-related programming for students, and initiatives that extended high-quality art offerings to the community.

In February 2020, two performances of *The Three Little Pigs* invited families to explore familiar stories with Eisenhower Dance and Detroit Chamber Winds & Strings. Presenting original contemporary dance and a world premiere work by Harriet Steinke, these art forms combined with illustrations by Emily Bolam, and narration to create a unique experience for the whole family.

In October 2020, a reprise of *Little Red Riding Hood* was presented in a virtual format to comply with COVID guidelines as set forth by the State of Michigan.

Oakland Community College's campuses in Highland Lakes, Auburn Hills, Orchard Ridge, Southfield, and Royal Oak hosted Inside|Out, with 15 images installed across all five campuses.

DIA staff met with Dr. Jennifer Berne via Zoom in July 2020 to provide a VTS overview and review past activities with DIA.

Scholastic Art Awards

The Detroit Film Theater was the site for the award ceremony for the 2020 Southeastern Michigan Region of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards competition.

The DIA partnered with Detroit's College for Creative Studies to coordinate events, attended by approximately 2,000 students, family members, and their guests.

Art & Authors

The DIA collaborates with Oakland County public libraries to provide literary programming.

In partnership with the DIA, Novi, Southfield, Rochester Hills & Auburn Hills Public Libraries presented an online author chat with cartoonist and *New York Times* bestselling author Jeffrey Brown. Brown answered questions, demonstrated drawing for viewers, and gave a behind-the-scenes look at his creative process, including his new series, Space-Time.

Canvas Pontiac

In partnership with Downtown Pontiac – Main Street Pontiac and the Pontiac Arts Commission, the DIA provides support to Canvas Pontiac's efforts to bring art and culture to the community.

DIA staff provided jurying and consulting services for the handcrafted and photography entries.

DEAFC.A.N!

The DIA continues to work with DEAFC.A.N! to increase access to the Museum and provide virtual programming for the deaf, hard of hearing, and DeafBlind visitors.

In 2020, the DIA and DeafC.A.N! created a series of art talk videos in American Sign Language featuring artwork in the museum's collection and available online.

In partnership with Bloomfield Hills Deaf and Hard of Hearing magnet program which serves DeafBlind and Hard of Hearing K–12 students throughout Oakland County, an artist demonstration and interview video interview was created featuring the work of Nancy Rourke and her experience as a deaf artist. This video was made available to Deaf, DeafBlind and Hard of Hearing students and a program was created in which they made their own paintings in response. The resulting paintings will be combined into a single mural-like piece for display at Bloomfield Hills Schools.

DeafC.A.N.! will continue to advise the DIA on how to reach and serve Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing visitors. Future efforts include a deaf artist in residency program, video interviews for the Deaf Arts Festival, and assessment of DIA online programs.

Alzheimer's Association of Michigan

The Minds on Art partnership between the Detroit Institute of Arts and the Michigan Alzheimer's Association provides facilitated museum gallery talks and artmaking in the DIA studio for people with Alzheimer's and other dementia and their care partners.

Due to COVID-19, the program was virtual in 2020.

Oakland County Parks and Recreation

In partnership with Oakland County Parks and Recreation Department, the DIA presented a virtual program featuring the history and evolution of Motown music.

Musician and songwriter Drew Schultz played Motown classics with a presentation and demonstration on the evolution of the "Motown Sound".

Girl Scouts of Southeast Michigan

The Girl Scouts of Southeast Michigan held their Religious Diversity Journeys program at the DIA in January. Over 200 Girl Scouts from Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties attended this program. The scouts participated in an app-based scavenger hunt focused on religious themes in art; watched a documentary called "The Children of Abraham" in the Lecture Hall; and had a panel discussion and pinning ceremony in the Museum.

Additional Outreach

Community engagement talks, focused on protocols for reopening and visiting the Museum during COVID 19, were provided to the Optimist Club of West Bloomfield and the Rotary Club of Troy.

Community Group Art Making Program

The DIA partners with local social service agencies through the Studio Community Group Program. Oakland County groups participated in art making and Visual Thinking Strategies sessions in the Museum and virtually after March 13.
