ADMISSION

SCHOOL PROGRAM

The DIA provides free field trips, both virtual and in-museum for K-12 students in Oakland County. In-Museum experiences include free transportation.

In 2022, **9,797** Oakland County students participated in field trips to the DIA with free bus transportation and **1,544** Oakland County students participated in guided virtual field trips.

Field Trips are available by reservation and engage students in person and through live online forums. Students ask questions, engage in discussion, and take part in activities that promote critical-thinking and close-looking.

Guided field trip experiences, both virtual and in-person, include:

Learning to Look, grades 2–4: Combines open-ended discussion and activities to help students connect to their thoughts and feelings, as well as to the experiences of others.

Thinking Through Art, grades 3–12: Concentrates on open-ended, student-centered discussions using the Visual Thinking Strategies pedagogical approach and gallery engagement activities.

Shaping Identity, grades 3–12: Focuses on the following DIA collection and curricular areas: *Art of the Americas*, *Art of the Ancient World*, and *Shaping Identity, World Languages*.

Shaping Identity, combined with Thinking Through Art, grades 3–12: Explores the breadth of the collections in combination with directed and open-ended discussions and activities.

Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) and Art, grades 5-12: Provides tours tailored to teachers' specific learning goals. Tours may consider themes of friendship, creativity, gratitude, generosity, kindness, patience and/or honesty, followed by a self-guided or teacher-led activity or a teamwork exercise.

Homeschool Afternoons: Offers collaborative, learner-centered artmaking in the DIA Learning Center & Studio and guided museum tours to local homeschool families.

Survey data is collected after each field trip or educator workshop, and the results are used to inform changes to programming.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT & SUPPORT FOR EDUCATORS

The DIA continued to work collaboratively with Oakland County educators to design customized curriculum resources to support field trips, including self-guided activities as well as pre- and post-visit classroom connections. New teacher resources available in 2022 included classroom activities for *The New Black Vanguard: Photography between Art and Fashion*, and *By Her Hand: Artemisia Gentileschi and Women Artists in Italy, 1500-1800*.

New Learning Resources were also developed for a series of pilot programs around Human Rights and Art. The DIA collaborated with professionals from Justice by Design, a program from Harvard's Graduate School of Education. The pilot program included input from 25 educators from Oakland County schools who are interested in developing critical thinking around the choices artists make, the voices and messages present or absent in their works of art, and the types of power that can be observed.

DIA Delivered



DIA Delivered educational kits connect the school curriculum to objects in the Museum's collection and provide opportunities for critical thinking, discovery, and artmaking.

DIA Delivered includes a variety of lesson plans to help teachers utilize this resource in the classroom or in a virtual learning environment. Kits are available for East Asian Art, African American, and American. Kits are in

development for West African, Native Peoples, Ancient Middle Eastern, and Ancient Egyptian.

Kits were provided to Reuther and Hart Middle Schools in Rochester, Van Hoosen and West Middle Schools in Rochester Hills, Beechview Elementary in Farmington, Rogers Elementary School in Pontiac School District, Paideia Homeschool Hybrid program through Oxford Virtual Academy, and St. Fabian Catholic School in Farmington Hills, serving 2,053 students.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TEACHERS

The DIA offers professional development workshops for teachers that model and develop curriculum-related activities for immediate in-person or virtual classroom application.

The DIA actively recruits schools/districts to develop collaborative, customized professional development opportunities for teachers. Adjustments have been made to offer programs on virtual platforms.

*Oakland County World Languages

This workshop was developed for Oakland County language educators to provide participants with an overview of DIA education program. The event included a sample field trip featuring objects relevant to the teaching of world languages and learning resources.

*Athens High School Innovation Committee

The DIA education team met with this group to explore potential resources to support teachers in their work around the concept of innovation.

***Bloomfield Hills Administrators’ Retreat**

Administrators were introduced to the DIA’s educational offerings, previewed the forthcoming pilot program with JusticexDesign, experienced a model field trip, and made use of the DIA’s meeting spaces for district business.

***Cranbrook Kindergarten Collaborative Workshop**

Cranbrook kindergarten teachers met with DIA educators to discuss expanding and diversifying the group of artists they discuss in the classroom. Over a dozen artists were identified and DIA educators provided potential engagement activities to support each artist’s work.

***Bloomfield Hills Social Studies Workshop**

Middle school and high school teachers were introduced to the DIA’s educational offerings, previewed the forthcoming pilot program with JusticexDesign, and experienced model field trips. Tours were tailored to fit the individual teachers’ needs, including focus on World History, World Geography, US Government, Psychology, and Sociology.

***Palette for Collaboration**

Teachers explored portraits in the DIA galleries followed by a hands-on interactive inquiry into the properties of paint, developing ideas, exploring color, and shaping personal expression on palette paper in the process of painting a simple portrait.

***Rochester Community Schools Partners in Inquiry**

Participants gathered observations and natural material from Peck Park near the museum and returned to the DIA Studio to explore the themes and interests related to the natural world. Teachers discussed possible applications for their own classrooms.

ADDITIONAL ENGAGEMENT WITH OAKLAND COUNTY SCHOOLS

Teacher Advisory Group

The DIA’s Teacher Advisory Group (TAG) includes three teachers from Oakland County. This group provided feedback about existing professional development experiences and classroom resources and assisted in designing teacher events. Educators from Derby Middle School in Birmingham, Center for Advanced Studies, and the Arts (CASA) in Oak Park, and Thompson K-8 International Academy in Southfield participate in the Teachers Advisory Group.

TAG is currently being expanded to include 5 educators each from Oakland, Wayne, and Macomb Counties.

Teen Arts Council



The DIA's Teen Arts Council includes students from Detroit high schools. Teen Council members collaborate with diverse peers from local high schools and museum professionals to design and implement relevant and meaningful programs for teens.

ARTS BEATS & EATS

The DIA provided programming for the DIA Kids' Stage at Royal Oak's Arts, Beats, and Eats. The DIA Kids' Stage featured an exciting and diverse roster of performances, programmed by the DIA, ranging from puppetry to magic, storytelling to juggling. Performers included Ballet Folklorico De Detroit and Authentic Native American Dance from Ho-Chunk Nation.

CANVAS PONTIAC

In partnership with the Pontiac Downtown Business Association and the City of Pontiac, the DIA supported Canvas Pontiac's efforts to bring art and culture to the community. The DIA also provided jurying and consulting services.

COMMUNITY GROUP ART MAKING PROGRAM

THE 14th ANNUAL COMMUNITY GROUP EXHIBITION

The 14th Annual Community Group Exhibition included artists from Troy Public Schools ESL and Oakland Livingston Human Services Association. MINDS ON ART

The DIA has continued a collaboration with Alzheimer's Association through the longstanding *Minds on Art* program by providing materials and monthly online art classes.

OAKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE

The DIA and Oakland Community College (OCC) develop partnerships to raise visibility and awareness for both institutions, build new audiences, and increase appreciation for the relevance of the arts and continued education in everyday lives.

Highlights of the partnership agreement include bus trips to the museum, Introduction to Visual Thinking Strategies for faculty, field trips for dual enrollment students and Inside|Out installations on all OCC campuses.

SCHOLASTIC ART AWARDS

The DIA partnered with College for Creative Studies to coordinate virtual events for the 2022 Southeastern Michigan Region of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards competition, attended by approximately 2,000 students from Wayne and Oakland Counties and their family members, and their guests.

ADDITIONAL ENGAGEMENT

The DIA provided jurying services for the student exhibition “Our Natural World” held at the Baldwin Public Library featuring students from Birmingham Public Schools and Bloomfield Hills Schools.

On October 23, the DIA hosted an event for the Detroit Jewish Book Fair. DIA Assistant Curator of Modern European Art, Dorota Chudzicka facilitated a conversation with journalist Hugh Eakin about his book *Picasso’s War: How Modern Art Came to America*. Docent-led guided-gallery tours were available, free of charge, after the conclusion of the program.
