In 2022, more than 166,000 Wayne County residents received free general museum admission.

SCHOOL PROGRAM

The DIA provides free field trips, both virtual and in-museum for K-12 students in Wayne County. In-Museum experiences also include free transportation.

In 2022, 14,915 students participated in field trips to the DIA with free bus transportation.

More than 1,200 students participated in guided virtual field trips.

Field Trips are available by reservation and engage students in person and through live online forums. Students ask questions, engage in discussion, and participate in activities that promote critical-thinking and close-looking.

Guided field trip experiences, both virtual and in-person, include:

- <u>Learning to Look</u>, grades 2–4: Combines open-ended discussion and activities to help students connect to their thoughts and feelings, as well as to the experiences of others.
- <u>Thinking Through Art</u>, grades 3–12: Concentrates on open-ended, student-centered discussions using the Visual Thinking Strategies pedagogical approach and gallery engagement activities.
- o <u>Shaping Identity</u>, grades 3–12: Focuses on the following DIA collection and curricular areas: *Art of the Americas, Art of the Ancient World*, and *Shaping Identity, World Languages*.
- o <u>Shaping Identity, combined with Thinking Through Art</u>, grades 3–12: Explores the breadth of the collections in combination with directed and open-ended discussions and activities.
- Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) and Art, grades 5-12: Provides tours tailored to teachers' specific learning goals. Tours may consider themes of friendship, creativity, gratitude, generosity, kindness, patience and/or honesty, followed by a self-guided or teacher-led activity or a teamwork exercise.
- Homeschool Afternoons, Offers collaborative, learner-centered artmaking in the DIA Learning Center & Studio and guided museum tours to local homeschool families.

Survey data is collected after each field trip or educator workshop, and the results are used to inform changes to programming.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT & SUPPORT FOR EDUCATORS

DIA DELIVERED



DIA Delivered educational kits connect the school curriculum to objects in the Museum's collection and provide opportunities for critical thinking, discovery, and artmaking.

DIA Delivered includes a variety of lesson plans to help teachers utilize this resource in the classroom or in a virtual learning environment. Kits are available for East Asian Art, African American, and

American. Kits are in development for West African, Native Peoples, Ancient Middle Eastern, and Ancient Egyptian.

Kits were provided to Cesar Chavez Lower Elementary, Hoover Middle School, Tau Beta and Early Childhood Elementary, Plymouth Community Arts Council, Metro Charter Academy, A Homeschool in Garden City, Blue Sky Academy Homeschool, Dickinson West Elementary, MACC Development Summer Camp, and Mason Academy in Detroit, serving 659 students.

The DIA continued to work collaboratively with Wayne County educators to design customized curriculum resources to support field trips, including self-guided activities as well as pre- and post-visit classroom connections. New teacher resources available in 2022 included classroom activities for *The New Black Vanguard: Photography between Art and Fashion*, and *By Her Hand: Artemisia Gentileschi and Women Artists in Italy, 1500-1800*.

New Learning Resources were also developed for a series of pilot programs around Human Rights and Art. The DIA collaborated with professionals from Justice by Design, a program from Harvard's Graduate School of Education. The pilot program engaged eleven educators from Wayne County schools in developing critical thinking around the choices artists make and voices and messages present or absent in works of art.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TEACHERS

The DIA offers professional development workshops for teachers that model and develop curriculum-related activities for immediate in-person or virtual classroom application.

Inspired by an exploration of the DIA's collection and observations and natural materials gathered in a nearby park, participants learned about connecting raw materials to learner-centered themes and applications to classroom learning.

Teachers were introduced to the DIA's educational offerings, experienced a guided field trip, learned about the *Ofrendas: Celebrating el Día de Muertos* exhibition, and participated in a Visual Thinking Strategies session.

*Dearborn Schools Printmaking Exploration

Teachers visited the exhibition *Printmaking in the Twenty-First Century*, followed by a hands-on interactive inquiry into a variety of traditional and innovative printmaking techniques and their potential for addressing current social issues and individual expression.

The DIA actively recruits schools/districts to develop collaborative, customized professional development opportunities for teachers.

ADDITIONAL ENGAGEMENT WITH WAYNE COUNTY SCHOOLS

DPSCD CULTURAL PASSPORT PROGRAM

Detroit Public School Community District 2nd graders participated in the free field trip program in 2022. A self-guide resource was created to provide students a diverse introduction to the collection. The DIA also worked with five DPSCD teachers to co-create learning resources to support the field trip experience for the 22-23 school year.

TEACHER ADVISORY GROUP

The DIA's Teacher Advisory Group includes four teachers from Wayne County. This group provided feedback about existing professional development experiences and classroom resources and assisted in designing teacher events. Educators from Hamtramck, Dearborn Heights #7 and Detroit Public Schools Community participate in the Teachers Advisory Group.

TAG is currently being expanded to include 5 educators each from Oakland, Wayne, and Macomb Counties.

TEEN ARTS COUNCIL



The DIA's Teen Arts Council includes students from Wayne County high schools. Teen Council members collaborate with diverse peers from local high schools and museum professionals to design and implement relevant and meaningful programs for teens.

BEHIND THE SEEN - IN THE COMMUNITY & VIRTUAL

Presented by trained DIA teaching volunteers, Behind the Seen art talks bring insight about the DIA's collection from the museum to the community. Talks last up to one hour and are available to adult civic and social groups, libraries, senior centers, and other community-accessible locations in Wayne County.

PARTNERS IN PUBLIC ART

Partners in Public Art is a collaboration between the Detroit Institute of Arts, and community organizations in Wayne County to co-create community-driven, highly visible public works of art that express the unique stories and interests of each community.



The DIA is partnered with the City of Wyandotte and The Downriver Council for the Arts on a mural that celebrates the Detroit River and the industrial history of the city. The design was completed in 2022 and the mural will be painted in 2023.

WAYNE COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL ART EXHIBITION

High school students in Wayne County were invited to submit their work for consideration for the first year of the Wayne County High School Art Exhibition (June 25 - July 31, 2022) at the Detroit Institute of Arts. This juried exhibition featured over 80 artworks by 60 artists from across Wayne County. Participating students were invited to an opening event and provided with a catalogue and poster of the show. CONCERT OF COLORS

July 16-24, 2022, The DIA celebrated the 30th year of Concert of Colors which returned as a live outdoor event. The DIA and its lawn were center stage for this global and free festival under the Detroit sun. Museum staff worked closely with Ismael Ahmed, who passionately established this amazing event in 1993, to make the DIA a crucial platform for this celebration of creativity in collaboration with the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History, the Scarab Club, and the Michigan Science Center.

The roster of national and international artists was phenomenal and included performers from Kyiv (Ukraine), the celebrated singer and song writer Alejandro Escovedo, the singer, composer, educator and performer Martha Redbone known for her unique mix of folk, blues, and gospel, as well as a full representation of Detroit's Caribbean artistic community, among many others.

DETROIT PUBLIC SCHOOLS STUDENT ART SHOW

In partnership with Detroit Public Schools Community District, the DIA presented the 85th Annual Student Art Exhibition. In 2022 the exhibition returned to the museum, while also offering digital opportunities for engagement, and featured work created by DPSCD students in kindergarten through 12th grade. OFRENDAS: CELEBRATING EL DÍA DE MUERTOS 2022

In celebration of Día de Muertos, the DIA, in partnership with Detroit's Mexican Consulate and the Southwest Business Association, presented a community exhibition of Ofrenda altars.

SCHOLASTIC ART AWARDS

The DIA partnered with Detroit's College for Creative Studies to coordinate virtual events for the 2022 Southeastern Michigan Region of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards competition, attended by approximately 2,000 students, family members, and their guests.

COMMUNITY GROUP ART MAKING PROGRAM

The DIA works with local social service agencies through the Studio Community Group Program. The following groups participated in classes with materials provided by the DIA.





- The John D. Dingell VA Medical Center returned to the DIA artmaking studio for a four session clay exploration series in April and May, as well as a four session wood landscape project series in September and October.
- ♦ Mariners Inn and DIA studio staff collaborated for potter's wheel days at Mariners, followed by glazing and a tour at the DIA in May, September, and December
- Alannan Center participated in a series of 3 sessions in October to create multimedia projects inspired by the artwork of Vincent van Gogh.
- ♦ Alternatives for Girls painted vinyl collage squares as part of their summer program and fall after school program in July and October.

WAYNE COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

The DIA and WCCCD develop partnerships to raise visibility and awareness for both institutions, build new audiences, and increase appreciation for the relevance of the arts and continued education in everyday lives. Highlights of the partnership agreement include senior bus trips to the museum for WCCCD's Silver Circle Program, Introduction to Visual Thinking Strategies for faculty, field trips for dual enrollment students and Inside | Out installations on all campuses.

DANCEABILITY

The DIA welcomed over 20 guests in late August from the Danceability program in Wayne County. This program seeks to work with individuals of varying levels of mobility, to express themselves creatively via movement and dance. The program consisted of lunch, a movement-themed guided-gallery tour, and a facilitated movement program in Rivera Court.

ADDITIONAL ENGAGMENT

The DIA partnered with Henry Ford Health for two sessions in July in which medical professionals were introduced to Visual Thinking Strategies. Participants learned skills to improve their practice, from diagnostics to patient interaction. Implicit bias is also examined within the Visual Thinking Strategies framework.
