SCHOOL PROGRAM

The DIA provides free field trips, both virtual and in-museum for K-12 students in Oakland County. In-museum experiences include free transportation, available by reservation.

In 2023, 17,152 Oakland County students participated in field trips to the DIA with free bus transportation.

Students ask questions, engage in discussion, and take part in activities that promote critical-thinking and close-looking.

Guided field trip experiences, both virtual and in-person, include:

Introductory Tours

Learning To Look | Grades K-2

Designed for our youngest learners, students will explore artwork created in different mediums made by artists from diverse cultures. Using fun hands-on activities and thinking routines like I see, I think, I wonder, students will critically look at and discuss art.

Recommended for young learners who are visiting the DIA for the first or second time.

Thinking Through Art | Grades K–12

Students will explore artworks to promote critical thinking, visual literacy, and communication and collaboration skills using Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS), an inquiry-based teaching strategy. Guided by three simple questions (What is going on in this image?, What do you see that makes you say that?, What more can you find?), students will look at art, observe, evaluate, and synthesize what they see, and construct meaning individually and as a group.

Recommended for groups focusing on skill building and personal meaning making. Historical information is not layered into student discussion.

Shaping Identity: A Broad Cross-Cultural Exploration | Grades 3–12

Through discussion and a variety of activities, students explore how people of diverse cultures use art to define, reinforce, and communicate personal, cultural, and national identity. Our most popular tour! Recommended as a general introductory tour of the museum for older students. Students explore art while learning about its historical context.

Specialty And Collection-Based Tours

Social And Emotional Learning Tour (SEL) | Grades K–12

Attention to social and emotional competencies can build a more caring world. Join us as we use art to explore self-awareness, community, and decision-making while building upon students' existing social and emotional skills.

NEW! Write Way to Art Tour | Grades 6–12

Art is often inspired by stories that have been popular across time and cultures. Art can also inspire writing itself. Students will explore the intersection between writing and visual literacy by creating an original piece of writing inspired by their experience with artwork.

Specialty And Collection-Based Tours Continued

Shaping Identity | Grades 3–12

Africana: Explore art from the African diaspora.

Art of the Americas: Explore art from North, Central, and South America, including the Ancient Americas and Native American art from the colonial period to the present.

Art of the Ancient World: Explore ancient art from Africa, Asia, Egypt, Europe, the Middle East, North America, and South America.

World Cultures and Languages: Make connections to the classroom by exploring art from Spanish, French, or Arabic speaking parts of the world. May include Arabic, Asian languages, French, German, and Spanish art.

Science + Art Tours

Putting The Steam In Stem In Rivera Court | Grades 4–6

Gallery teachers engage students in open-ended discussions strategies. Student teams work their way through a science and technology problem solving adventure as they explore Diego Rivera's Detroit Industry Murals. Capacity is 60 students. Limited availability. Mondays only. Allow 3 hours.

Putting The Steam in Stem in Conservation | Grades 6–12

Science students observe and work with members of the DIA's Conservation Lab while exploring works of art. Students learn how scientific investigations authenticate, date, and preserve works of art in the museum's world-class collection. Limited to 60 students. Limited availability of one day per month. Allow one hour.

<u>Technological Innovations Through The Ages | Grades 3–12</u>

How do art and technology intersect? On this tour, students will explore important technological innovations expressed through artwork from ancient times to the modern world and contemplate the impact these advances have had on society today. Limited to 60 students.

Gallery + Art Studio Experience

Meaning Through Art-Making | Grades 3–8

Students engage in discussion of art in the galleries, followed by hands-on experiences in the DIA's Art-Making Studio. Printmaking and mixed media experiences available. (Two hours). Available to schools within Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties.

Survey data is collected after each field trip or educator workshop, and the results are used to inform changes to programming.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT & SUPPORT FOR EDUCATORS

The DIA continued to work collaboratively with Oakland County educators to design customized curriculum resources to support field trips, including self-guided activities as well as pre- and post-visit classroom connections. New teacher resources currently in development include topics of Buddhist Traditions and early Italian Renaissance bronzes.

In collaboration with the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam, Netherlands, the DIA helped offer a series of learning activities and free reproduction of Vincent van Gogh's *The Bedroom*. Nine teachers from Oakland participated in this program.

The DIA continued to offer Oakland teachers the opportunity to participate in a pilot program called Power in Art, formerly called Human Rights and Art. The DIA collaborated with professionals from Justice by Design, a program from Harvard's Graduate School of Education. The 2023 Spring pilot program included nine educators from Oakland County schools who are interested in developing critical thinking around the choices artists make, the voices and messages present or absent in their works of art, and the types of power that can be observed.

DIA Delivered

DIA Delivered educational kits connect the school curriculum to objects in the museum's collection and provide opportunities for critical thinking, discovery, and artmaking.



DIA Delivered includes a variety of lesson plans to help teachers utilize this resource in the classroom or in a virtual learning environment. Kits are available for East Asian Art, African American, and American. Kits are in development for West African, Native Peoples, Ancient Middle Eastern, and Ancient Egyptian.

Serving **1066** students in Oakland County, kits were provided to International Technical Academy in Pontiac, West Middle School in Rochester, Birney K-8 School in Southfield, Troy Athens High School, Farmington STEAM Academy, West Bloomfield High School, and Levey Middle School in Southfield.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR TEACHERS

The DIA offers professional development workshops for teachers that model and develop curriculum-related activities for immediate in-person or virtual classroom application. The DIA actively recruits schools/districts to develop collaborative, customized professional development opportunities for teachers.

Professional Development for Teachers Continued

*The Environment as Teacher: Webster Early Childhood Studio Workshop

Motivated by an exploration of the DIA collection and observations and natural materials gathered in a nearby park, participants worked creatively to represent subjects related to the natural world and relevant to their own learners' interests. Participants learned about connecting raw materials to learner-centered themes and discussed possible applications in their classrooms.

*Global Education Excellence Introduction to the DIA + VTS Workshop

Participants learned about everything the DIA offers educators, including learning resources, field trips, workshops, and more. Participants were also introduced to Visual Thinking Strategies. Techniques for implementing VTS both in the museum and in the classroom were discussed.

*Another Way of Seeing: Art Studio Educator Workshop

After visiting the exhibition James Barnor: Accra / London, teachers discussed photos in terms of subjects, messages, and choices the photographer made to convey those messages. Participants explored the museum, taking photos of subjects they found interesting. They then worked in the artmaking studio to alter their photos using a variety of materials.

*Oakland County Educator Workshop

Participants in this workshop learned about everything the DIA offers educators, including field trip options, professional development opportunities, learning resources, and more. Teachers experienced model field trips led by DIA educators and discussed which objects in the DIA's collection best suit their classroom goals. The day also included a learning session in the DIA's artmaking studio, where participants experienced and discussed a collage project replicable in the classroom.



ADDITIONAL ENGAGEMENT WITH OAKLAND COUNTY SCHOOLS

Teacher Advisory Group

The DIA's Teacher Advisory Group (TAG) includes five teachers from Oakland County. This group provided feedback about existing professional development experiences and classroom resources and assisted in designing teacher events. Educators from Derby Middle School in Birmingham, Novi Middle School, Notre Dame Lower in Pontiac, and Thompson K-8 International Academy in Southfield participate in the Teachers Advisory Group.

Teen Arts Council



The DIA's Teen Arts Council includes 2 students from Oakland County high schools. Teen Council members collaborate with diverse peers from local high schools and museum professionals to design and implement relevant and meaningful programs for teens.

In June 2023, the Teen Council welcomed over 60 teens from across

Metro Detroit to participate in a Teen Gala. Youth heard from other empowering programs that offer opportunities for leadership skill building and arts-related enrichment activities.

OAKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE

The DIA and Oakland Community College (OCC) develop partnerships to raise visibility and awareness for both institutions, build new audiences, and increase appreciation for the relevance of the arts and continued education in everyday lives.

Highlights of the partnership agreement include bus trips to the museum, Introduction to Visual Thinking Strategies for faculty, field trips for dual enrollment students and Inside|Out installations on all OCC campuses.

COMMUNITY GROUP ART MAKING PROGRAM

The DIA works with local social service agencies through the Studio Community Group Program. The following groups participated in classes with materials provided by the DIA:

♦ Troy Public Schools ESL (English as Second Language)

DIA studio staff reached most of the adult learners in the ESL program in 2023, sharing the museum with people from all over the world. Two classes in February focused on collage. In April there were four classes focused on making clay pots and clay masks. All Troy ESL classes explored printmaking in the fall, covering seven different classes from September through November. All classes included highlight tours along with seeing artwork from participants' home countries.

♦ Oakland Livingston Human Services Association

Continuing a longtime partnership with OLHSA's *Grandparents Raising Grandchildren* program, DIA studio staff made 39 clay masks with the children and grandparents who visited twice in July. The masks were featured in all marketing for the 15th Annual Community Group Art Exhibition. OLHSA also visited the DIA in September and October for still life and picture frame projects.

♦ FAR Therapeutic Arts and Recreation

A new partner in 2023, FAR visited the DIA twice in July with two different classes making collage projects. Highlight tours were included in these classes, introducing brand new visitors to the DIA's collection.

THE 15th ANNUAL COMMUNITY GROUP EXHIBITION

SCHOLASTIC ART AWARDS

The DIA partnered with College for Creative Studies to coordinate two days of events for the 2023 Southeastern Michigan Region of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards competition, attended by approximately 1,600 students and their family members, and their guests.

INSIDE | OUT ACTIVITIES

In June, a group organized by the White Lake Township Library visited the museum with free transportation. The group had the opportunity to see some of the authentic artworks at the museum that had been reproduced in their community through the *Inside Out* program.

Also in June, Clawson hosted a DIA volunteer-led biking tour of the *Inside*|Out reproductions on display throughout the city. Cyclists explored artworks at Clawson City Park, the Fire Department, and several stops in between.

Inside | Out Activities continued

Johnson Nature Center in Bloomfield Township celebrated their participation in the *Inside | Out* program by hosting a ribbon cutting event in June. Following the ceremony, DIA volunteers partnered with naturalists from the Nature Center to offer guided tours of the grounds, focusing on the art and the surrounding environment.

In November, Commerce Township Library held a special event to celebrate the close of the 2023 season of *Inside|Out*. Eight reproductions that had been on display in the community were relocated to the library for a special public art talk with DIA docent David Galli.

Arts Beats & Eats

The DIA presented family-friendly entertainment on *The DIA Kids' Stage* at Royal Oak's Arts, Beats, and Eats. *The DIA Kids' Stage* featured an exciting and diverse roster of performances, programmed by the DIA, ranging from puppetry to magic, storytelling to juggling. The 2023 performance lineup featured Ballet Folklorico de Detroit, Authentic Native American Dance Ho Chunk Nation, Milndia & Rockin' Raaga Indian Dance, and Revolution Chinese Yoyo.

ADDITIONAL ENGAGEMENT

In partnership with the Jewish Community Center of Metropolitan Detroit, Pulitzer Prize-winning and international best-selling author Noah Charney joined DIA Deputy Director of Art, Education, and Programs Judith Dolkart for a public event in the DIA's Lecture Hall in October. They discussed Charney's book, *Brushed Aside*, a deep and focused look at the history of women in the art world that celebrates great women artists and influencers whose work has been overlooked far too long. Following the talk was a DIA docent-led tour of women artists highlighted by Charney.

Community Engagement Managers attended the Royal Oak Senior Expo at the Royal Oak Farmers' Market as well as the Southfield/Lathrup Village Senior Expo at the Southfield Pavilion. At DIA information tables, free senior benefits were promoted and a video featuring footage of the interior of the museum was displayed to encourage viewers to share memories and inspire future visits to the museum.

Curator of African Art Nii Quarcoopome presented an overview of the James Barnor: Accra/London, A Retrospective at a meeting of the Senior Men's Club in Birmingham on Friday, July 28. The meeting was attended by 92 members in-person with nearly 30 more participating online. The presentation was followed by a lively Q & A and luncheon. The group later visited the DIA on a free bus in late September to see the exhibition.

In February, the DIA's Director and Conservator of Special Projects, Barbara Heller, provided a community lecture for the Society of Active Retirees (SOAR) about Art of the 70s. The presentation covered Minimalism, Post-Minimalism, Photorealism, Feminist Art, Neo-Dada, the local Cass Corridor Movement and Post-Modernism. The virtual presentation showcased 52 works of art from the DIA collection by 43 artists.

In spring, Barbara Heller served as a juror for two shows at Birmingham's The Community House. She juried the *Our Town Art Show* as well as the *Student Art Town* exhibition. Barbara participated in award presentations at both shows and provided a STEAM lecture at the student show.
