## Wedding, Engagement, Senior Photos and other Organized Photography

- Filming and Photography are allowed for free outside the museum, as long as it doesn't interfere with museum business. This space can and will be reserved for normal museum business at the discretion of the museum. When it is open, please do not disturb visitor access and be considerate of others. Drones are absolutely prohibited.
- **No** Wedding, Engagement, Senior Photos and other Organized Photography is permitted inside the building, unless the space is rented. Wedding photos are only allowed if you would like to host your Wedding event at the DIA. To reserve your wedding, please email <a href="mailto:catering@dia.org">catering@dia.org</a>

## Personal Film/Photography

- Selfies are encouraged! Feel free to share them on social media, but please don't disrupt other visitors. <u>Flash photography is not allowed</u>. No photography equipment, including, but not limited to selfie sticks, go pros, tripods, etc.
- Celebrations and impromptu gatherings can disrupt others and endanger artworks and are not allowed.
- Some exhibitions may restrict personal photography. Please check before taking photos.

## Press, News, Influencers, Content Creators and Media Film/Photography Policy

• Must obtain permission from the Marketing & Communications Department before filming inside the DIA. Please email <a href="mailto:pr@dia.org">pr@dia.org</a>. All video and photography shoots need approval and scheduling in advance.
